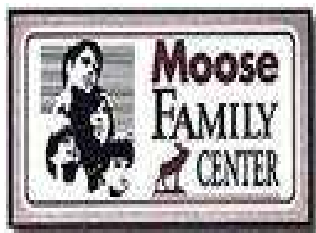

# Lodge Happenings

## A Change for Youth Night :

We have seen our youth night on the second Friday of the month decline in attendance and feel a change in format may help. The economy has hurt and opening the large hall on Friday nights to possible revenue generating ventures such as hall rentals or special events might help. Our youth night will be moving to Saturday mornings from 9am to 12pm. It will start out for two Saturdays a month, the second and the fourth Saturdays. It will now be more in line with a youth center with more activities and games for the kids. Cartoons and movies, pool and shuffleboard tournaments with lessons for beginners, Wii Sports, crafts, board and card games will also be played. We are also going to feed the kids breakfast or lunch, with our older kids maybe helping with the cooking if they wish. Prizes will not automatically be distributed but may be part of the games. A DJ will also not be part of the event but we may feature music on occasions. We will also celebrate birthdays or other special recognitions of the kids.

Parents do not have to be with the children as we will have monitors to supervise activities. Kids must be able to go to bathroom themselves to be without parental supervision. This may allow parents some free time to get weekend chores done. Kids must be picked up by 12pm unless previous arrangements have been made. Hopefully we can continue to grow our youth center with field trips such as golfing or fishing, ball games and other outside activities. It will be successful only if kids and parents get involved in our new youth Center format. Our ideals and the youth center will grow or improve with your input.

The Officers feel this new format will allow us to better communicate with our youth and be part of their activities. We will also have the kids interact with our kids at Moosehaven and our seniors at Moose Haven by sending cards and gifts. The Officers also feel Saturday mornings will be a safer atmosphere in the lodge with more time being devoted to the kids. Please let us know what you think, the first Youth Center day will be April 10. Hope to see you there.

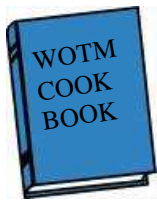
## WOTM NEWS:

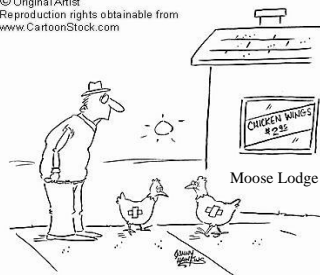
