# A Brief History of Mooseheart Fieldhouse

The celebration of the Golden Anniversary of the founding of Mooseheart reached its climax with the formal dedication of the Mooseheart Fieldhouse on June 16, 1963, the opening day of the 75th International Convention of the Loyal Order of Moose.

The cost of the building (more than \$600,000) was raised through voluntary contributions of Moose Lodges, Chapters, Moose Legions, State and Provincial Associations, and individual members. In addition, the Legion of the Moose raised more than \$65,000 to pay for air conditioning in the building, and the Mooseheart Alumni Association contributed over \$2,000 for two scoreboards.

Included in the Fieldhouse are a regulation basketball court, an indoor track (one-twelfth of a mile in length), a jumping pit and an in-

door rifle range. The exterior of the building is 250 feet in length and is 100 feet wide.

Portable bleachers provide seating for 1,900 persons. In addition, more than 2,000 chairs can be set up on the basketball court and track to provide a total seating capacity of about 4,000 for high school commencement exercises and other meetings.

The Fieldhouse was built adjoining the west side of Illinois Memorial Stadium. Lockers and restrooms in the stadium were remodeled, and provide facilities for the field house. The foyer between the stadium and the Fieldhouse has been officially designated as the "Otto W. Meyers Foyer," in memory of the late director of the Moose fraternity's Membership Department.

A parking lot is situated just south

of the Fieldhouse to provide parking facilities. It can be reached from an entrance on Mooseheart Road, which runs past the south border of the Child City campus
