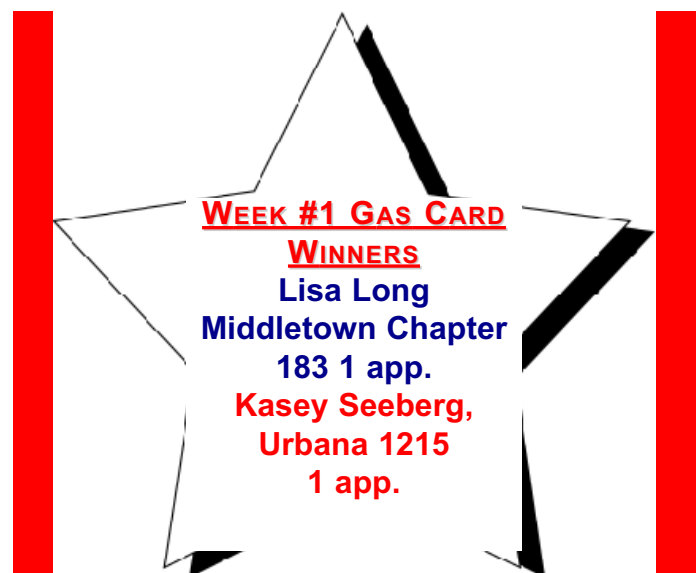

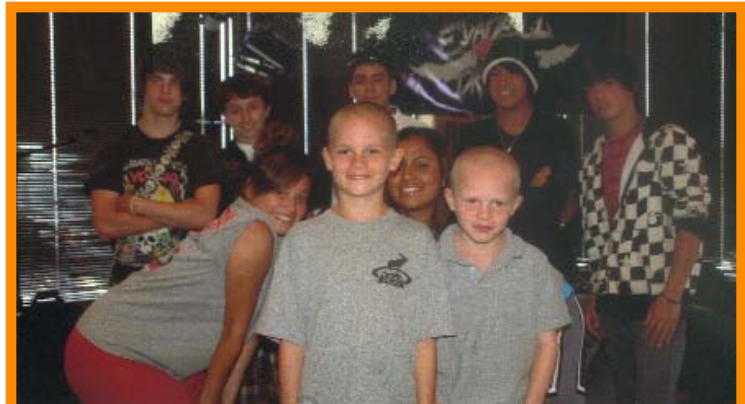


Worthington Moose Lodge 1427 Hosts A Welcome Party For Their Sunshine Children, and Include A Special Band!
