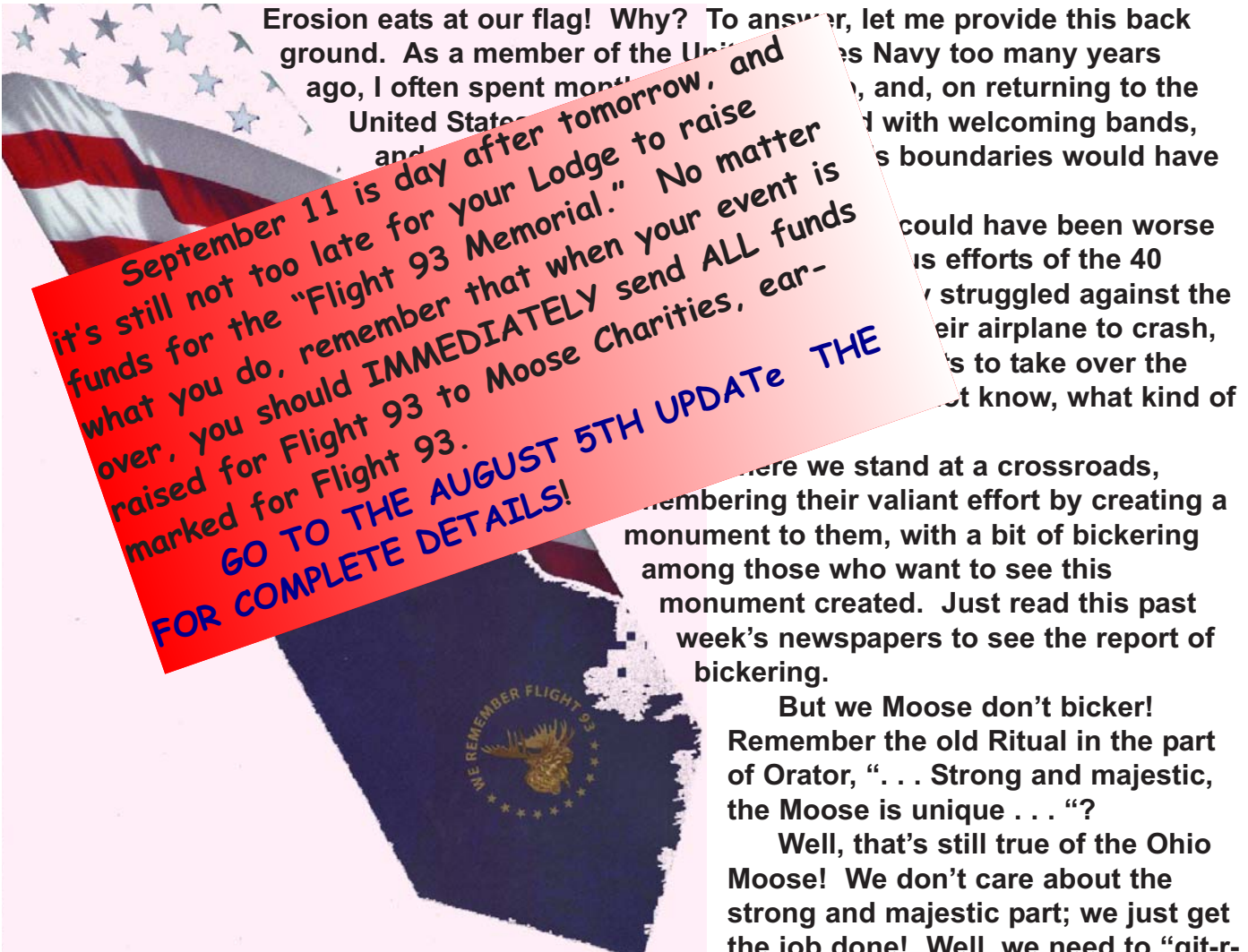

SO YOU'D LIKE TO BECOME A FELLOW?

Here's how to do it . . .

It's a simple process:

- 1) Your Lodge's Fellowship Recommendation Committee consists of ALL members of the Lodge holding the Fellowship Degree. Should a Lodge NOT have four Fellows, the committee shall consist of the number of available Fellows in the Lodge and the balance of the committee selected from the elected officers and the Jr. Past Governor.
- 2) Pay attention to details: The recommendation form MUST bear the signatures of (typewritten or printed signatures are not acceptable) four members of the recommendation committee. Committee members must indicate their Moose ID number and indicate any higher degree they hold. If any member of the committee is not a Fellow, then the current elected Lodge office held must be indicated (see #1 above).
- 3) A Moose Legionnaire must meet the following requirements as of September 30, 2009 to be recommended for the Fellowship Degree of Honor:
 - FIVE years continuous membership in the Loyal Order of Moose AND ONE year in the Moose Legion.
 - Sponsored at least ONE Moose Legionnaire and *working towards* membership in the Moose 25 Club within his Lodge.
- 4) The Fellowship Recommendation Form **must** have **every** question answered and all blanks filled in or the form **will not** be considered. The resume of outstanding service must also be attached to the form. NOTE: Accuracy of dates and statistics is very important.
- 5) Reproductions or outdated recommendation forms **will not** be accepted.
- 6) All recommendations must be kept strictly confidential. **A breach of confidentiality will jeopardize the degrees of all the parties involved, including that of the prospective candidate.**
- 7) Detach the instruction page. Attach the service resume for your recommendation to the completed recommendation form, make a copy of this form for your files, and return the original form to your Regional Manager in a timely manner.
