**Mission...** The mission of the Special Olympics Ohio is to provide year-round sports training and competition opportunities for children and adults with intellectual disabilities.



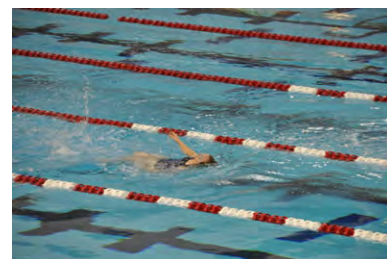
**Benefits...** Special Olympics contributes to the physical, social and psychological development of the athletes.
