RULES & REGULATIONS

FOR PRIVATE

SOCIAL QUARTERS OPERATIONS

1. All members of the Order in good standing possessing a current membership card shall be admitted to the social quarters.
2. A qualified guest may be defined as follows:
 - a. An active Lodge or Chapter member's spouse may be admitted as a qualified guest into a Social Quarters of a lodge as many times as they'd like, unless the spouse's membership is in expired status.
 - b. Anyone, age 21, or older, may visit the lodge twice; then either join, or not come back.
 - c. Any active member's children (or other immediate family) under the age of 21 may visit the Lodge as many times as they'd like until they reach the age of 21.
3. All guests and the introducing member shall enroll their names in the lodge guest register.
4. Family members, friends or unmarried members and prospective members **MUST** leave when the member leaves.
5. Only good standing members of the lodge and chapter are permitted to make purchases or spend any money in the social quarters. Non-member spouses, family members, guests, may not make purchases.
6. Every member shall submit his or her membership card upon demand of the House Committee or any authorized social quarters' employee.
7. All non-members shall be identified to distinguish them as guests.
8. Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests. A member may be dropped from the rolls for failure to pay restitution for property damaged or removed by the member of his guest.
9. The admission of minors into the social quarters shall be according to guidelines established by the House Committee in accordance with local laws.
10. Gentlemanly, ladylike and orderly behavior is required of all persons in the social quarters and at all other times while on lodge property or during any Moose sponsored social activity. Loud, profane and obscene language is absolutely prohibited.
11. No person(s) of vicious or immoral reputation, or in a state of intoxication shall be admitted or allowed to remain in the social quarters. The bartender is authorized to refuse service to anyone in a state of intoxication. The House Committee may prevent admission of any undesirable pending a hearing.
12. The social quarters shall not be used for any event involving non-members, unless dispensation is received from the General Governor prior to the event.
13. Social quarters' hours shall be established by the House Committee. It is unlawful for any member(s) to be present in the social quarters during the hours it is closed. The social quarters shall immediately close if disruptive to any official lodge or chapter meeting.
14. A dress code shall be established by the House Committee. It is unlawful for anyone to remain in the social quarters in violation of this code.
15. Any member(s), other than a law enforcement officer in the line of duty, having firearms or other lethal weapons on, or in his possession in the social quarters, parking lot, or any other lodge property, shall be expelled from the Order, unless the weapon involves a sporting event or other activity approved by the General Governor. This does not apply to legal weapons which at all times remain in locked vehicles and are not in violation of any law, rule, regulation or ordinance.
16. It shall be the duty of the House Committee and its authorized employees to strictly enforce these rules.
17. Any member involved in fighting in the social quarters, or the lodge hall, or patio area, will be removed from the property.
18. Any guest involved in fighting in the social quarters, lodge hall, or patio area, will be removed from the property, and never again be allowed onto the property.

Any member(s) violating these rules may be removed from the premises and denied social privileges until reinstated by the House Committee. Any member(s) charged with violations of these rules and regulations shall be entitled to a hearing before the House Committee.
